A well-written abstract serves multiple purposes: an abstract lets readers get the gist or essence of your paper or article quickly, in order to decide whether to... Writing an Abstract for Your Research Paper – The Writing ... Students usually find it difficult writing a standard abstract for their project work. In order to know how to draft a good abstract, students must know how a standard abstract should look like. A standard abstract must have the following.

1. Introduction or background of the study.
2. Method of research or research methodology.
3. Results and findings.
