Ordinary Level (O' Level) is Form 1 through Form 4. After Form 4, a certificate is issued to all passing the Certificate of Secondary Education Examination (Tanzania). Selected students may progress to Advanced Level (A' Level) education - Forms 5 and 6 - or study for an ordinary diploma in a technical college. This is evident among women aged 20-24; only 20% completed secondary schooling, while 20% have no formal education. Enrolment rates rise in Tanzania with free secondary education Challenge. In

2007, Tanzania achieved nearly universal access to primary education. However, since then, enrolment of primary school-aged children has been dropping. An estimated 2 million children between the ages of 7 and 13 years are out-of-school. Almost 70 per cent of children aged 14–17 years are not enrolled in secondary education while a mere 3.2 per cent are enrolled for the final two years of schooling. The Education and Training Policy of 2014 is the main education policy in Tanzania. Among other changes in the education sector, it allows one year of free and compulsory pre-primary education and ten years of free and compulsory basic education (6 years of primary and 4 years of lower secondary) (ETP, 19).
